



Driving Tour – Scenic Midland Trail Byway

This section of US Route 60 starts in White Sulphur Springs and winds west, dipping into river valleys and crossing over mountain ranges before following the Meadow River to Rainelle.

DISTANCE (POINT-TO-POINT)

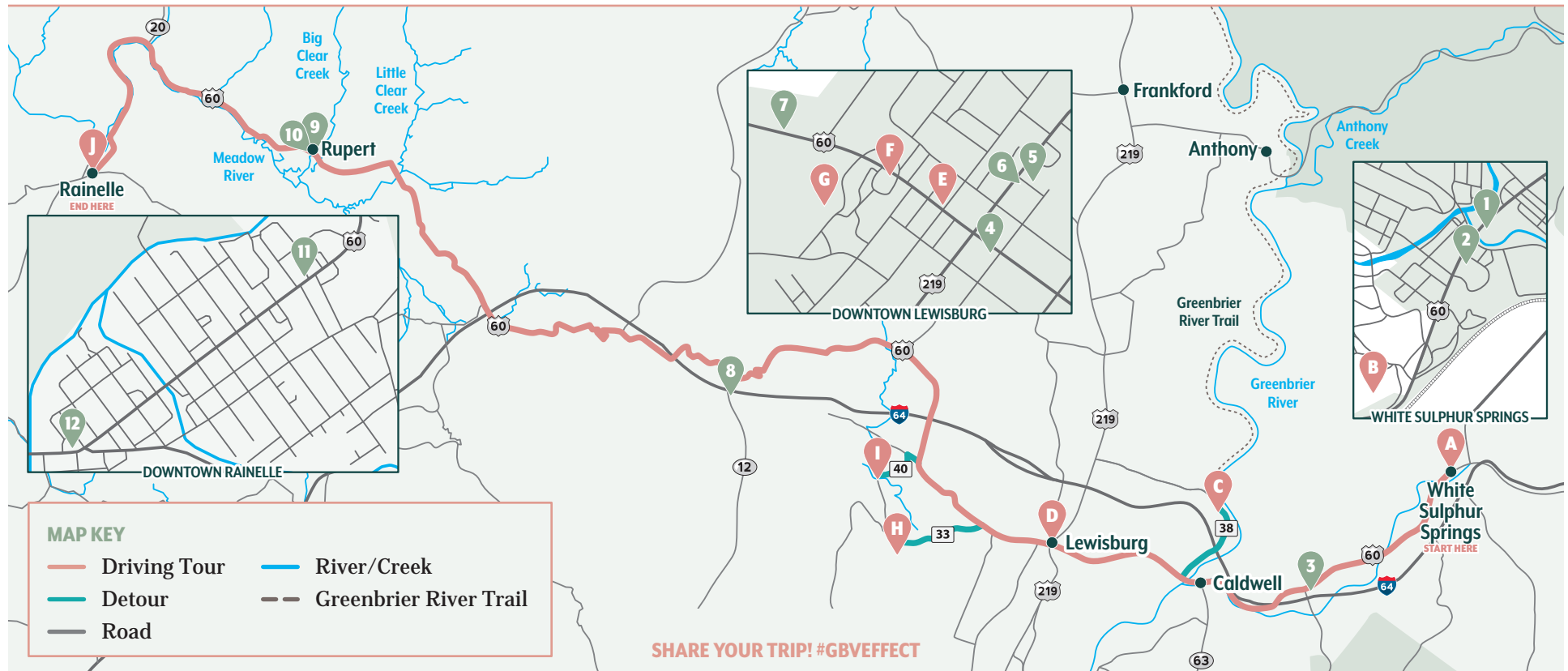
40 miles – starts in downtown White Sulphur Springs and ends in Rainelle. A portion of this route may not have cell service. After downloading the route from Google Maps, turn on “avoid highways” to improve results.

POINTS OF INTEREST

Stops are listed in order of the driving tour. See letters on map. Before heading out, check the hours and reservation requirements for each business.

- A Downtown White Sulphur Springs**
Starting point
Your tour starts in the center of downtown, where shops and restaurants line Main Street.
- B The Greenbrier**
Open to day-trippers, take a stroll around the grounds. Formal gardens, luxurious ballrooms and lavish salons impart a sense of the resort's rich and opulent history. greenbrier.com
- C Greenbrier River Trail *1.4-mile DETOUR***
Access the southern end of this 78-mile rail trail to glimpse the wild beauty of the Greenbrier River. greenbrierrivertrail.com
- D Downtown Lewisburg**
This historic downtown ranks on must-do lists from all over the country. Take time for a stroll along Washington Street to poke through the shops or enjoy a bite to eat. visitlewisburgwv.com
- E Greenbrier Valley Visitors Center**
For more information about other things to do in the area, be sure to stop by the visitors center. The team at the desk is a wealth of knowledge! greenbrierwv.com
- F North House Museum**
Take a docent-led tour of this historic home-turned-museum, offering insight into the region's past. greenbrierhistorical.org
- G Confederate Cemetery**
Visit the final resting place for 95 unknown soldiers who died in the 1862 Battle of Lewisburg.
- H Hawk Knob Hard Cider & Mead *2.3-mile DETOUR***
Set in the Greenbrier Valley countryside, relax pondside at the Hawk Knob tasting room for a sampling of traditional hard cider. hawkknob.com
- I Hems Mill Covered Bridge *1-mile DETOUR***
Drive across one of only two covered bridges in the county.
- J Downtown Rainelle *Ending point***
Take a break at one of the local eateries. This historic downtown was once a bustling industrial center boasting the world's largest hardwood lumber mill.
